Function of Godparents and Sponsors:

- Represent the Church in receiving the person into the communion of the Church.
- Demonstrate and set an example of a Catholic Christian life.
- Support through prayer, conversation, and example.

Godparents and Sponsors must meet the following criteria (Canon Law 874):

- Received Sacraments of Initiation in the Catholic Church (Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist) or made a Profession of Faith through RCIA.
- They must be 16 years of age or older.
- They cannot be the mother or father of the person being represented.
- Must live a life of faith which benefits the role to be undertaken. This includes:
 - o If married, their marriage is recognized by the Catholic Church.
 - Attend Mass regularly on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation.
 - Sincerely believes and strives to be put into practice the Word of God as taught by the Catholic Church.

One Godparent/Sponsor is required. Two Godparents/Sponsors may be appointed provided the following conditions are met:

- At least one must meet all criteria above.
- One may serve as a Christian witness, with certain provisions (Canon Law 874.2):
 - o There must be at least one Catholic godparent
 - Baptized Catholics who are sacramentally or canonically ineligible to serve as a godparent may <u>not</u> serve as a Christian witness. (This includes those who have renounced the faith in favor of another church community or entity.)
 - o Those unbaptized and those whose Baptism is not recognized by the Catholic Church may <u>not</u> serve in the role of Christian witness but are welcome to be present at the ceremony.

A sponsor must be fully initiated into the Catholic Faith. Please let us know where you received your Sacraments of Initiation. If you are unsure of dates, you can find out by contacting your church of Baptism.
